Frequently Asked Questions -- This list is not exhaustive. As always, feel free to contact the Principal, Mr. Read, at bread@svcsd.org or (315) 839-6315 with any questions or concerns.

Q: When will school reopen?

A: As it stands now, school is scheduled to reopen on April 30. The work picked up on April 15 is designed to last through April 29. Students who have Internet access at home will also be assigned tasks online through Google Classroom, email, etc. We remain responsive to directives and guidance from our state and local officials and will keep you informed of any updated information.

Q: Will meals continue to be provided during the extended closure?

A: Yes, we will continue to provide meals during the extended closure.

Q: How do I turn work in?

A: We have dropboxes -- one for each grade level -- in the vestibule at our main entrance. Students and parents are encouraged to drop completed work into these boxes at any time.

Q: How will this impact Regents exams?

A: June Regents exams are canceled. Any student enrolled in a course that was scheduled to culminate in a Regents exam will get graduation credit for both the course and the exam as long as the student passes the course. This means it is extremely important for students to be keeping up with their coursework during the school closure as both course and Regents credit depend on it.

Q: Am I going to be graded on this work?

A: Yes, students can expect to receive grades for this work, primarily as a means of providing teacher feedback on their progress. Students can expect to receive information from their teachers on how specific grades will be calculated.

Q: When will progress and report cards be available?

A: We will maintain four marking periods, and the third marking period has been extended. It will now end on Friday, May 1 (two weeks after it was originally scheduled to end). Third quarter report cards will be mailed the week of May 4. A decision on the fourth quarter progress report will be made at a later date.

Q: How will course averages be calculated?

A: For full-year courses, final course averages will be calculated by averaging 5 numbers: each of the four quarter averages and the midterm score. For second semester courses, the final course average will be an average of the third and fourth quarterly averages. Class rank will be determined after the third quarter, as it has been in years past. Students enrolled in AP courses will receive the 1.1 weight for these courses in their cumulative grade point averages.

Q: Are there online instructional supports available?

A: Yes, and our teachers are able to provide information. Several of our teachers have Google Classroom websites and other support websites. Please see the attached page for information about these supports. You may also contact teachers for more information. Please know that online access at home is NOT REQUIRED for students.

Q: What about the status of spring sports, the prom, senior trip, etc.?

A: All school-based events, including spring sports, are postponed through April 29. Any school closure beyond April 29 will likely impact the senior trip and the senior prom. We remain responsive to updated guidance from state and local authorities and will keep you updated as additional information becomes available.

Q: What work am I expected to complete for my BOCES (Career and Technical Education) program?

A: Several BOCES teachers are utilizing online platforms including Buzz, Google Classroom, Zoom and online textbooks. Some have based take-home assignments on program textbooks and others have mailed instructional packets to students. Packets will be collected and graded upon student return to campus. Regarding communication, teachers are relying on a variety of methods including Buzz, Google Classroom, Remind, Zoom, email, and phone calls home. Depending on the method used, these contacts range from daily to once per week. SchoolMessenger was also utilized to deliver information to all students and parents.

Q: How will this impact Advanced Placement (AP) exams?

A: Advanced Placement exams will still occur. The exams will be offered online, and students will take them from home if school is closed at that time. This will ensure students an opportunity to still get college credit for their AP course(s). For more information, or if you have any questions regarding AP exams, please contact your AP teacher(s) or Mr. Scialdone.

Q: Can I still get my working papers?
